

Easy Laying of Greyhounds



Introduction

In this greyhound system, we are going to use a process of elimination to cut out a few greyhounds and come up with the one greyhound that we are happy to lay.

Lay it. It loses. You profit. REPEAT!

OK, admittedly that does trivialize it a little too much but it really can be that easy and it can be realized using this selection method. It's a little time consuming but the great thing is that it can be used on ANY greyhound race in the UK.

Boy this is easy! Let's get to it, shall we?

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The System

In this method, we will be using the Betfair form page and of course, you will need an account on Betfair if you want to lay the greyhounds.

1. Go the next greyhound race that is going to occur for the day. It's rare for a greyhound to have odds of higher than 7.5 so we don't really need to worry about the liability here. It won't be that high compared to laying horses.
2. Got your race? Then on the Betfair race card click the blue link to go to the greyhound form page where you will want to find the race you are interested in.
3. It will look like this:

You are interested in the circled figures.

4. Write down the 6 greyhound numbers and then cross off any numbers that are mentioned in the circled area. In this case, we would cross off 2, 4 and 6 so we are left with 1, 3 and 5.
5. More often than not, you will cross out 4/5 greyhounds. You would then look at the odds of the remaining greyhounds and would then lay the greyhound with the lowest odds. You don't want to lay a greyhound with odds of 7.5 or more. If you are left with just one greyhound then this is your laying pick.

Scarily simple... Brilliantly profitable! But **let's look at this all a little bit closer!**

We will assume you are laying with £25 lays and we will assume EVERY greyhound you lay is at our worst odds of 7.5 - This means for every win you profit £25 and for every loss you lose £162.50.

That sounds bad, doesn't it! In this case, you would need a strike rate of 98% to profit. Now that's RIDICULOUSLY high. But we have gone for the highest odds.

The AVERAGE odds we experience with this is 4.0 and this would then see a profit still of £25 but a loss of £75. This would therefore require a strike rate of just 75% which is far more achievable and HAS been achieved using this method.
