


Finding Football Teams to Lay (in ANY League)

Introduction

For this method, we are going to be looking at laying either one of the teams in a football match or the draw. It all comes down to a few criteria.

The great thing here is that we will be laying at fairly low odds. Nothing over 5.0 which means with a £100 stake (and therefore a £100 profit) you will have a maximum liability of £400 - For a football laying system, this is pretty good going.

The system might be short, it may be fairly straight forward BUT that doesn't mean it's not effective. This is the system for you if you like to watch football but are also into lay betting.



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The System

This isn't complicated, below are a few steps to follow through with to come up with your selections for the day. It will work in ANY football league from around the world so you're not limited to the main leagues of the world... If you REALLY want, you can tackle the Chilean leagues or the Mexican ones!

1. First go to a football match where the favourite has odds of 1.8 or higher. You don't want to be betting in markets where there is a REALLY clear favourite. That is why the 1.8 minimum is put in place. Besides that... Go for ANY match! We have opted for the AC Milan Vs Zenit St Petersburg match where you can see the match is pretty evenly matched.
2. Click the "Head to Head" tab as circled in the image to the right. You will need to have access to the stats for the current positions of the teams, the previous meet between the teams and the previous results.

If you cannot get these stats from the Head to Head tab on Betfair, then you will have to obtain them elsewhere. Generally, the less popular leagues will have less stats but there will be places to find these stats. Simply enter the two teams into google along with the text "Head to Head."

3. Now write down on a piece of paper Home Team, Away Team and The Draw.
4. Put a 5 next to the home team and then put a 5 next to the favourite according the current odds on Betfair.
5. Look at the most recent meeting between the two teams and then the team who won, put the number of goals they scored next to that team. AC Milan won with 3 goals to 2 and we would therefore put a 3 next to the AC Milan. If the game was a draw, but the number of goals each team scored besides the draw on the piece of paper.
6. Look at the three most recent results for each team and make sure you only look at the home results for the home team and the away results for the away team. Put a 5 for each win, put a 3 next to the draw if they drew and if they lost, put a 1 next to the other team.
7. Finally, discover their position in the league they play in and put this number at the end of each list of numbers but place it in brackets.

You should now have a list of numbers besides Home, Away and Draw (some of them might not have a number) but you should still have a collection of numbers.

On the next page, you can see what it would look like for our example and what move to take next.

Here is our list for the AC Milan Vs Zenit St Petersburg match, just to the right.

Now add all the numbers up besides the number in the brackets and then subtract the number in the brackets.

Home Team: 5, 5, 3, 5, 1, (7) = +12

Away Team: 1, 5, 5, (3) = +7

Draw: 3 = +3

We currently have +12, +7 and +3. Now it's time to come up with who you are going to be laying exactly. So:

IF the difference between the home team and the away team is GREATER than 3, then lay the team with the lowest odds.

IF the difference between the home team and the away team is LOWER than 4 and the draw is 3 or less then lay the draw.

IF any other scenario, then ignore the game!

So there you have it, in our example, we would lay our away team which happens to be Zenit St Petersburg.
